The meeting was called to order by GODHH Acting Director Usherla DeBerry at 6:12 p.m.

The December 6, 2023, meeting minutes were approved by the board. DeBerry then led the board in an ice-breaker activity.

Old Business

GODHH Communications and Policy Manager Payal Scharmacharya shared information about the Open Meetings Act training the board members must complete as soon as possible.

GODHH Policy Manager Katherine Breen provided an overview of the 90-day turnaround period for

early Spring 2024. She also provided an update on the vacant DeafBlind position on the board; the appointment process through the Governor's Office of Appointments has been postponed until after the legislative session concludes. In the meantime, we will solicit input on the regulations from DeafBlind groups and community members.

Breen then reviewed that the deadline for submitting any changes to the legislation by Friday, January 19, 2024, along with the benefits and drawbacks for making changes:

- Even if we submit the law as it is, with no changes, we can still make changes to the regulations.
- If we submit changes to the legislation, this may weaken its standing, especially with the court system's desired changes.
- Any amendment to the law after January 19 will require open vote in both legislative chambers.

Breen also reviewed resources available to the board for development of regulations, and then discussed the board's responsibilities. She, along with DeBerry reviewed the GODHH's role throughout this process, and reviewed the timeline of SBSLI implementation.

New Business

The board agreed to keep the law as is for the January 19, 2024 deadline, and to focus on the regulations.

The next board meeting will be on March 6, 2024 at 6:00-8:00 p.m., and it will be held virtually once again.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:32 p.m.
